A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Jurien Bay Marina

As we all know the Jurien Bay Marina has had issues with weed wrack and fish kills within the marina precinct.

The body with responsibility for the marina is the Department of Transport. They have undertaken a number of studies and consultations over the years to develop the best options for solutions to the ongoing issues.

In December 2023, the Hon David Michael took on the portfolio of Ports and Minister assisting the Minister for Transport. CEO Brent Bailey and I immediately sought a meeting with the Minister to advance the cause of dealing with the issues surrounding the marina. We met with the Minister on 12 February 2024 and laid out the issues surrounding the marina and the negative impact on the further economic development of our town. The Minister listened and gave us assurances that he would follow up with the Department to get a resolution to the problem.

Following on from this meeting the CEO and I were invited to meet with the Premier Roger Cook on 22 March 2024 to discuss the issues faced by the Shire of Dandaragan as a growing local government.

We narrowed down the issues to three main obstacles that are impeding the growth of our Shire.



These were access to a reliable power distribution network across the Shire, infill sewage to the older areas of our towns to allow for greater density in our town centres and of course we raised the Jurien Bay Marina weed rack issue. Again, the Premier listened to our concerns and understood the impact those issues were having on our growth and economic development across the Shire.

We are hopeful that our advocacy on behalf of our Shire has had an impact, and we will see some positive outcomes as we continue to work with the State Government on improving the liveability of our Shire.

State Government Budget Briefing Lunch

The Wheatbelt Development Commission in conjunction with the Jurien Bay Chamber of Commerce have been successful in securing the Minister Hon David Michael to undertake a budget briefing in Jurien Bay the day following the budget delivery in the State Parliament. This will be the first time that we have secured a budget briefing in Jurien Bay.

Sandy Cape

Over the Easter break the Sandy Cape Campground was once again the target destination for many of the visitors to our region.

The Shire has developed a Sandy Cape Management Plan and as part of that plan an online booking system for select areas will be introduced to ensure that visitors that wish to use the Sandy Cape campground can do so by booking in advance and having a particular site allocated to them.

All other campers will be directed to the overflow camping areas in Jurien Bay and Cervantes. Campers not using the designated camp areas will be asked to move on.

This will take some of the pressure off our treasured Sandy Cape.

The Shire is also undertaking planning for ensuring that our four-wheel drive tracks are properly managed. The proper management and maintenance of our four-wheel drive tracks will ensure that the fragile coastal areas are accessible into the future and not destroyed by users that are not doing the right thing.

To assist with the proper management of the tracks we will be deploying number plate recognition cameras to assist with vehicle monitoring and compliance.

We welcome our visitors, but we must ensure that these beautiful areas are left in as good condition after their visit as they were before the visitors arrived.

Spray The Grey Youth Festival

It has been ten years since the first Spray the Grey Youth Festival at Weld Park on Hastings Street.

Since that initial Festival the Shire has built a new youth area in Dobbyn Park that is the envy of many regional towns. Spray the Grey has developed into a massive festival that seems to grow bigger and better each year.

The Shire of Dandaragan is very proud of this festival. The festival is sponsored by the Shire to ensure that the event is completely free for young people across our Shire. It is also a great event for visitors to Jurien Bay during the Easter break with many of the visitors amazed that they can have all this fun at no cost.

I would like to thank the many sponsors, community groups and local businesses that get behind the Spray the Grey Youth Festival. The Shire staff work hard every year to make the festival a success. Many of them volunteer their time on the day to ensure setup is completed on time and the young people have a great experience. Thank you to everyone for making this Youth Festival the success that it is.

Restricted Burning Period Extended


Until 28 April 2024 (subject to change)

As a result of unexpected dry weather conditions, the restricted burning period has been extended for the coastal localities within the Shire of Dandaragan.

This area includes all properties WEST of Munbinea Road, in a line extending from the Shires northern boundary on Cockleshell Gully Road, along Munbinea Road to the corner of Wongonderrah Road, then stretching south in a straight line to the intersection of Meadows Road and Indian Ocean Drive, ceasing at the southern boundary of the Shire on Indian Ocean Drive.

Anyone wishing to light a fire west of this boundary will require a permit to burn unless the fire complies with the Shires Camping and Cooking Fire Policy. A permit to

burn can be obtained from a Fire Control Officer, contacts for which can be found in the Fire Break & Hazard Reduction Notice or on the Shires website.



Landholders east of this boundary are asked to only undertake necessary burns for agricultural, hazard reduction or business purposes until rainfall improves conditions.

Please ensure that you inform your neighbours, check for Total Fire Bans and are aware of the weather conditions before lighting a fire during this time.

Funding will not be greater than 50% of the total cost of the project described in the application and the grant is on the basis that the organisation will match the grant on a dollar-for-dollar basis. WA PLAN FOR PLASTICS - STAGE TWO REQUIREMENTS FOR BUSINESSES

The Plan for Plastics was released in response to community feedback and provides a roadmap towards a more sustainable, plastic-free WA. The plan promotes actions that:

- prioritise avoiding single-use plastics
- replace single-use items with reusable alternatives wherever possible
- promote non-plastic single-use alternatives that can be recovered, recycled or composted if it is not possible to use reusable items
- minimise litter or contamination of waste treatment facilities by not using single-use plastic.

The plan includes regulations to ban single-use plastic items in a two-stage approach. Stage 1 regulations are complete. Regulations for Stage 2 items took effect on 27 February 2023, to be fully phased out by 1 July 2025. The Stage 2 regulations ban businesses from the sale and supply of:

- · loose and moulded expanded plastic packaging
- degradable plastics (plastics designed to break up more rapidly into fragments under certain conditions).
- · produce bags
- expanded polystyrene cups and food trays for raw meat and seafood
- coffee cups and lids
- · plastic lids for cups, bowls, trays, plates and takeaway food containers
- trays for food not covered in the Stage 1 ban
- cotton buds with plastic stems
- microbeads.
