The Shire of Dandaragan already has one of the highest concentrations of renewable power in Western Australia with a total production capacity of over 460 MW, including

- Emu Downs Solar Farm (20 MW)
- Badgingarra Wind Farm (130 MW)
- Badgingarra Solar Farm (17.5 MW)
- Yandin Wind Farm (214 MW)

Renewable sources of generation capacity in WA are expected to grow from 15% in 2019 to 45% in 2030. The Shire of Dandaragan is strategically located to provide an ideal location for renewable power generation.

The Shire of Dandaragan is the ideal location for renewable energy investments as the region offers:

- Some of the strongest and most consistent winds in the country
- Access to large, expansive land parcels, conducive to renewable power arrays
- Direct access to the transmissions lines of the South West Interconnected System (SWIS), providing power to Perth and the South West of the State
- Direct access to key transportation routes for installations and maintenance

The Shire of Dandardgan has a diverse economy with key industries, including agriculture, fishing, tourism, mining and renewable energy generation. The local rock lobster industry based in Cervantes and Jurien Bay provides a major export for the Shire. The Lobster Shack is a major tourism attraction generated off the back of the local lobster industry, which coupled with the Nambung National Park's Pinnacles Desert, Lesueur National Park and the Jurien Bay Marine Park, creates major tourism attractions for the region.

While traditional industries of beef cattle and sheep dominate the local agricultural sector, a wide variety of crops are grown in the Shire including olives, citrus, stone fruit and broad acre farming. Mineral sands mining at the Cooljarloo Mine (Tronox) and the Cataby Mine (Iluka) as well as the Yandin Wind Farm (largest in Western Australia) are additional key assets of the local economy and demonstrates its diversity.
