SUMMARY

101 people from the community of Jurien Bay gathered together to discuss what they love about their community, what they would like to see change, key opportunities and key projects or investments they would like to see happen.

The following workshop results outline the key assets that were brainstormed on the night and were subsequently grouped together by the facilitator. The results also show the key constraints that the community believe are holding them back or not allowing them to reach their full potential. The community also identified key opportunities for Jurien Bay. These are all listed as they were written by the community. If a number is behind the idea that shows how many people also had the same idea.

After the brainstorming session, the community broke into nine small groups and problem solved and developed some creative responses to the constraints, maximising the opportunities and ensuring the assets are kept through whatever development process the community chooses. The results from those four groups are presented. Where the group chose priority investments or projects, the priorities are shown in the table.

These results will be further developed into the Community Strategic Plan. However, the results do belong to the community so please distribute and discuss more broadly with your family, friends and community groups. The next process involving the community will be held later in the year.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR JURIEN BAY

Sport and recreation

- Centralise sporting facilities to bring community together
- More water based sports and activities ie aquatic centre
- Theme/aqua park
- Sports Commission should start 14 year old development squad for footy as promised three years ago
- Motor sport venue
- Combine delivery of sewerage with development of a reticulated regional golf course
- Construction of multipurpose trails, including equine
- Coastal hiking/riding trail

- Facilities to play hockey and other sports
- Jurien Community Centre great complex, has potential to accommodate great sporting events and general events - potential to develop, room to expand
