1)	<b>BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING</b>	<p>1.1 Rasheen Lee presented an updated Jurien Bay Foreshore Style Guide: Material Finishes and Furniture Suite x 2, Jurien Bay Foreshore Style Guide: Public Art and Interpretation.</p> <p>Members indicated agreement with presented Locator plan and requested some kind of bespoke shelter and seating area adjacent to the Rest in Reef area of the foreshore to enable people to gather when reef balls are being laid.</p> <p>A selection of trees and plants were crossed off including pines and Morton Bay Figs, and Native Wisteria and Pea Flower.</p> <p><b><i>Action: Rasheen to develop the design drawings with remaining species and bring to a future working group meeting</i></b></p>
2)	<b>NEW BUSINESS</b>	<p>2.1 Chris and Colm from Convic presented the most recent Jurien Bay Skatepark design. They explained the skatepark terrain style with a beginners/intermediate bowl at the southern end, an intermediate/advanced bowl section at the northern end with fast and slow street style zones</p>

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		<p>in the middle. This would allow for multi-age, multi-skill users. The discussed how skateparks are generally used with some skating and others watching and users taking turns. Capacity of the JB skatepark would be around 22 in total at any one time which is a reasonable capacity. The design would allow for events to be held here due to the layout, shade and seating areas and proximity to the foreshore and other activities. The design draft pointed out where a half/quarter basketball court could be located and other facilities such as drinking fountains and wheelchair access.</p> <p>The lowered skatepark is now at a maximum platform height of 1m at its highest point at the northern end which means better visibility out to the coast and reduction in wind.</p> <p>An example of sports lighting was shown and this will be something Convic will have to design and quote in the coming weeks.</p> <p>The colour scheme of the skatepark draws inspiration from the coastal sunset colours over the Bay where the setting sun hits the ripples in the water. This meant we had a yellow/red/ochre colour scheme which all supported.</p> <p>The group discussed the balustrading and signage at the northern end of the skatepark and indicated a desire to have local creative input into both the balustrade and signage. This will be done at a brainstorming session in the coming weeks.</p> <p><b>Action: WG members to send any further feedback about the skatepark design draft to Michelle prior to close of business Friday 2 October. Michelle to collate and forward to Convic.</b></p>
