1)	<b>BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MEETING</b>	<p>1. Playground – Tender has one out to WALGA suppliers with concept package for ‘nature-based’ theme.</p> <p><b><i>Action: MP to invite representatives from special needs student group (and parents) to provide feedback about playground at next meeting.</i></b></p> <p>2. Turning of the Sod went well at skatepark which was attended by Darren West and Shane Love as well as members of the working group and Shire staff.</p>
2)	<b>NEW BUSINESS</b>	<p>1. Seafront Estate Negotiations – BB outlined to the group the issues Seafront owners have with the skatepark and provided information about the requests Seafront representatives were asking to be changed which included preserving the views from their balcony, removing the concrete sign from the northern end of the skatepark and relocating to the southern end away from their line of sight, specific landscaping requests including addition of olive trees to line Heaton Street side of the skatepark consistent with olive tree plantings on the eastern side (Seafront Estate) of Heaton St road verge (image provided); relocation of the</p>

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		<p>corten decorative panelling from the balustrading at the northern end of the skatepark to a location elsewhere in the skatepark / picnic area and replace with a permeable balustrade, more in line with the original Convic balustrade design in order to keep the views through the balustrade for Heaton St properties (particularly the most southern two properties). Working group was disappointed that the property owners had not engaged with the Shire up to this point, but understood that they are a key stakeholder and in order that the project is not delayed or compromised, were willing to negotiate on those items, including reverting back to some kind of vertical balustrading posts instead of the corten panelling (which could be incorporated into another area of the park). If original vertical posts were reintroduced into balustrading, the group agreed they didn't like the red colour and preferred a colour to fit with existing skatepark concrete theme, or alternatively a colour that fit with the beachside theme.</p> <p><b>Action: Convic to provide some alternative ideas for the balustrade as well as ideas for how to incorporate the concrete signage at the southern end of the skatepark, without compromising safety around the deep bowl at the northern end. MP will forward to working group when they are ready for viewing.</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. MP advised that signage for the skatepark design concept would be up in the coming fortnight.</li> <li>3. CB requested that an article be prepared for Craytales updating the community about the project.</li> </ol> <p><b>Action: MP to prepare and distribute to newspapers.</b></p>
