New Depot Operations Building

I was honoured to be asked to officially open the new Jurien Bay Depot Operations Building last week. Replacing the outdated old depot building, constructed in 1985, this new building is long overdue. Not only are the workspaces and facilities functional, but the new building also assists in boosting the moral of staff attending work each day.

The building design was a collaboration between Shire staff, local Cervantes builder, George Mostert of Central West Building, Maroochi Engineering and Olympic Drafting based in Perth.

The new building was constructed by George and his team from Central West Building, with landscaping and reticulation works undertaken by members of the Shire's Jurien Bay Operations Team.

A significant number of local contractors were also involved in the fit out and civil works and I would like to extend my thanks to them all for their contribution. The use of local contractors continues to be very important to the Shire as it stimulates our local economy by helping to create employment opportunities for small business.

Key features of the new building include a central training room, desk space for each staff member, modern amenities. including laundry washing facilities for those staff working with emulsion and paint products, outdoor sink area, energy efficient design including sealed concrete flooring in the and training offices room, accessibility access ramp into the building, and accessible toilets, including showering facilities.





Cultural Borders Welcome

A good friend of mine bought a lady, Shaz, for morning tea a couple of weeks ago who has come to live and work here from Iran. Shaz comes from a comfortable family background in Tehran and has enjoyed a great education and work life there. I was very ignorant of the education system there and could not understand how she, a female was so educated. I had, in my mind, compared her to Iraq, Afghanistan, and other places in that part of the world but I could not have been more wrong. In Iran, it is a status symbol to educate women and that is something families aspire to, however, as we are all aware things in that part of the world are also very volatile and many of these girls who are single are seeking to get away from their country. Shaz told us many stories of growing up in Tehran and how she loved her childhood in the great city of 9 million people. The wider metro area is home to another 16 million which makes it the second largest metro population in the Middle East.

My new friend's family moved here some years ago and she is staying with them until she establishes herself in WA. I have been able to assist her in updating her CV which is so impressive I was sure it would not be long before someone snapped her up for a good job.

That happened last week, and I was so thrilled for her as she will be a great addition to our country. When I got home from a very long day in Jurien Bay last week, I found a box of homemade biscuits on the doorstep with a lovely card thanking me for my help. We are so isolated here and it is very interesting to hear what goes on in the rest of the world, especially in Western Asia. Making new friends is such a joy for me and I love learning about the different ways of they live. It also is another reminder of how fortunate we are to have what we have here in Australia.

Recognising Indigenous Culture through Naming Project

had а very interesting presentation from WA Community Arts on the Naming Project that they have been rolling out all over the State. This is an amazing opportunity for us to have the Aboriginal names alongside the current names and learn the stories and history of this region from their perspective. Professor Len Collard will lead the extensive research across our Shire and work with our community through workshops and activities to capture and uncover the true meaning of these places. We are very excited to commence this project.



UK Bound

Only 8 weeks to go and I will be off on a long trip to see my mother in the UK and we will be there to celebrate her 94th birthday at her cottage in Devon. I spoke to her on the UK's Mother's Day last week and she is in very good spirits and looking forward to seeing us. This attitude helps a lot when navigating all the changes to society she will have seen in her very long lifetime. I hope to be able to share with you some interesting angles when I get back.

Details of the grant programs are:

- The Community Grants Program aims to provide funds to community-based organisations for events and activities in support of the development of social, economic, recreational, art and cultural benefits. The maximum annual grant payable under this program will be \$2,500.
- The Environmental Grants Program supports projects that benefit the environment and community through environmental improvement, sustainability education and the promotion and enabling of sustainable living as a way of life. ASBESTOS DISPOSAL IN THE SHIRE OF DANDARAGAN

Asbestos is a controlled waste under the Environmental Protection (Controlled Waste) Regulations 2004 and can only be accepted at the Jurien Bay Waste Management Facility by prior arrangement.

It is an offence under these Regulations to dispose of asbestos other than at a licenced waste facility, including other requirements, that must be adhered to prior to disposing of any asbestos items.

If you are unsure of any of the regulatory requirements, please contact the Shire's Principal Environmental Health Officer on (08)9652 0800 to discuss.

If you need to dispose of asbestos you must contact the Shire's Jurien Bay Operation's Supervisor to book an appointment on (08) 9652 0800. Delivery for disposal without an appointment cannot be accepted.



JURIEN EAST ROAD UPDATE



As part of the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network project's Jurien Bay to Dalwallinu route, current road reconstruction works on Jurien East Road are nearing completion.

Funded in partnership with both Federal and State Governments and the Shire of Dandaragan, recent reclaimer works have been completed through the wet mixing of the gravel pavement. Sealing Works due to commence mid-April which will see the road widened to a 8metre seal on a 10 metre pavement.



Open Burning Season

Saturday 1 April will see the opening of the unrestricted burning season in the Shire of Dandaragan commence. Whilst you do not require a permit to burn, your responsibilities when undertaking burning remain. You must not:

- · Light a fire and leave it unattended.
- Light a fire at the Shire's 72-hour short stay reserves.
- · Light a fire on a beach.
- Light a Camping or Cooking Fire at an approved location, including sandy cape, if not properly contained by a purpose-built structure (fire drum)
- Light or maintain a fire during a Total Fire Ban.
- Light a fire which you don't have sufficient resources to control.

It is recommended that you only burn off on days where the fire danger is not "High" or above, and that you register your burn on www.emergency.wa.gov.au by calling 9395 9209 five minutes prior to commencing. This will prevent unnecessary calls to 000 and strain on volunteer firefighters attending false alarm calls.

Lastly, don't forget to inform your neighbours, as the smoke may impact certain health issues, or they might prefer to hang their washing out on another day.

Smoke Alarms

Does April 1st mean anything to you? Besides it being a day of fun filled pranks for April Fools Day, it also marks a historically important day for fire services Australia-wide – that's right, it's time to change the smoke alarm battery.

Don't be a fool, don't wait for it to start chiming at odd hours of the night due to a flat battery, it's a small price to pay for something that might well save your life.



Total Fire Ban Breach

A Shire of Dandaragan property owner has recently been prosecuted and fined \$2,500 plus court fees, for the unlawful lighting of a fire on a day subject to a Total Fire Ban.




Volunteer firefighters were called to the property after a passer-by saw smoke and flames coming from several piles of vegetation and called 000. The individual admitted they had wilfully lit the fires before extinguishing them shortly after the fire brigade had arrived. Most of the district was subject to a Total Fire Ban on the day as temperatures soared above 40 degrees and winds peaked at over 40km/h.

The Shire urges all of its residents to be aware of the requirements when undertaking burning and/or fire mitigation activities. Draft Amended Local Planning Policy for Advertising Devices (Signage)

This Policy provides a framework for the design, placement and assessment of outdoor advertising signs within the Shire. This Policy intends to ensure that the display of outdoor advertising within the Shire do not adversely impact on the amenity of surrounding land while providing appropriate exposure for businesses, activities or services.

The draft policy proposes the following changes to the policy framework for this form of development:

- •Revise policy introduction and objectives accordingly.
- •Provide clear exemptions and interpretations.
- •Outline signage development application requirements and when a signage strategy will be required.
- •Outline clear protocols which apply to all signage.
- •Outline particular areas where signage will not be supported.
- •Provide specific protocols for common types of signage.


