Final Leg of Jurien East Road Upgrade

Works on the last leg of the Jurien East Road upgrade commenced late February as part of the Federal and State Government's Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network project. These works will commence 4km east of Indian Ocean Drive and consist of widening the road to a 10-metre pavement and 8-metre seal for improved safety for road users along this heavily traversed route. These works are being completed in-house by the Shire's Dandaragan Civil Works crew, and through the engagement of both local and external contractors. As this final leg is completed, it has taken several years, across various stages, for this road to be reconstructed thanks to funding allocated by both Federal and State governments and our Shire. We are extremely pleased to deliver such a significant project over the years to improve our road network along well-used commodity routes.

SHIRE OF DANDARAGAN COMMUNITY SCORECARD

The Shire of Dandaragan participated in the MARKYT® Community Scorecard – a state wide program to evaluate and benchmark our performance as a local government authority against all other participating councils, from large metropolitan councils to small remote local governments.

The scorecard invited the community to evaluate a range of local services, facilities and programs (managed by CATALYSE®, an independent research consultancy based in Western Australia).

An online scorecard was available, as well as hard copy scorecards delivered to ratepayers and residential post boxes using Australia Post unaddressed mail services. Scorecard invitations were emailed to all customer contacts in the Shire of Dandaragan community email list, and the Shire promoted links on its website, notice boards and social media pages. All residents, ratepayers, businesses and visitors were invited to take part.

Outcome:

There were 466 respondents to the survey, of which 326 were local residents (approximately 10% of the local population).


Strengths and Priorities are identified in the report – and a brief overview of what we are currently doing in the space of the priorities. Coastal environment and the marina were a big impact which are currently works in progress.

The Shire's overall performance score was 67/100, while slightly below industry average, was above the majority of regional local governments.

This survey will form a key part of our considerations and further consultation targets for the new Strategic Community Plan which is due for completion this year.

HOW YOU RATED US IN THE MARKYT COMMUNITY SCORECARD

Thank you to everyone who responded to the 2022 Community Survey. We have received some great feedback for us to work with and which will contribute to the development of our new Strategic Community Plan. There were a number of key community priorities identified in the Community Survey and we'd like to take the opportunity to provide an update on our plans and developments in each of these areas. We also invite you to peruse the full report available on our website.



NDUSTRY AVERAGE

Coastal area planning and management

The most significant feedback topic within this year's survey was the ongoing deoxygenation and fish kills at the Jurien Bay Marina. It remains Council's primary advocacy focus and we continue to engage with the State Government from multiple angles to seek improvement or resolution of the issue. Coastal inundation is also a concern for community members and we will be releasing shortly our adaptation plan for community input which has been in development over the past year.



Seniors services, facilities and care

The Shire acknowledges that many members of the community would like to see an expansion the in Aged Care / Living opportunities. It remains a key advocacy focus for the Shire and a driver of our plan to confinue to promote population growth in our region. Other common areas of feedback involved access to facilities and our footpath network which will continue to be a focus for our building services and infrastructure department.

Health and community services Expanding the scope of our health services

Expanding the scope of our health services and upgrading the Jurien Bay Health Centre to a recognised 24/7 Hospital was a common theme in community feedback. The Shire continues to advocate at the regional level for more state provided services and we remain committed to the support of local GPs in the region through our contracts with the Jurien Bay Medical Centre which is currently serviced by 3 highly valued GPs.

Building and maintaining local roads The Shire continues to ungrade main common

The Shire continues to upgrade main commodity routes within our road network in partnership with both Federal and State Governments through the delivery of the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network and Regional Road Group projects respectively. This year our sealed road reconstruction and upgrade programs total \$7.3m which amounts to approximately 80kms of renewed and resealed roads. Shire officers continue to apply for additional road funding and have recently been successful in securing road funding for 2023-2024 to commence new works on Jurien East Road, Agaron Road, and Gillingarra Road.

Sport and recreation facilities and services

*

The Shire acknowledges that our sporting and recreation facilities are a cornerstone of regional living. In 2022 we adopted our new Sport and Recreation Plan and are progressively working on improvement plans for each precinct through deep consultation with local sporting clubs. In addition, the Shire provides annual grant funding and facility maintenance to support our sporting clubs meet the needs of members. We will also continue to support our clubs with Club Development advice and resources.

Responsible growth and development

Growing with respect to our local culture and history was a key theme in the community comments. The Shire tries to respond to this sentiment within our Local Planning Framework and Strategic Planning processes which guide our own project delivery and our Town Planning Scheme, which influences the private sector developments proposed for our region.

Economic development and job creation

Creating employment opportunities, developing aged care facilities and building new housing to attract and retain workers were key areas of community feedback. Although these aspirations lie in the realm of the private sector, the Shire is actively working with Regional Development Australia, the Wheatbelt Development Commission and the State and Federal Governments to unlock funding to support developers, investors and businesses to undertake these important economic development initiatives.



Festivals events art and cultural activities

Social engagement, capacity building, health and wellbeing and economic development are all areas that benefit from an active offering of community arts and cultural events across the Shire. Community feedback indicated an improvement in the types and number of events held over the past two years is sought. The Shire continues to promote opportunities for community groups and event managers to host a range of events within the Shire via the Community Grants and Major Event Grant programs, both offered annually.



Development and activation

Community feedback requesting improvements to the aesthetics and amenity of our CBD's was a common theme. In Jurien Bay the Shire has engaged Place Laboratory to prepare a Town Centre / Central Business District Masterplan to guide future improvements of the shopping areas and activation of this locality, similar to that of the recent works undertaken at the Jurien Bay Foreshore. The final draft of the Masterplan is due in early 2023 and will be distributed for public comment before Council considers adoption of this plan.

Fire Season

Summer is over, but unfortunately bush fire season isn't quite in touch with the Gregorian Calendar! With most of the Shire having only received brief and isolated rainfalls over the last few months, the threat of bushfire impacting us is still quite apparent.

To date, firefighters across the Shire have attended more than 30 fires this season, with a total of over 5,600 Hectares of grass and bushland razed by out-of-control fires. Fire Service Volunteers and Staff from the Parks and Wildlife team have been busy over the past few months, with thousands of hours combined service this fire season; it is a blessing to live in an area so well protected by such dedicated people.

Restricted Burning Season

Restricted burning season begins on the 1st of March. To obtain a permit to burn throughout this period you will have to contact your local Bush Fire Control Officer. Given the dryness across much of the Shire, Officers may not approve a permit to burn as it may pose too much of a risk. Discretion will be used based on the type of burning activity you wish to do, location, current or forecasted weather conditions and what measures you have in place to safely undertake the activity.

If you are denied a permit from one Bush Fire Control Officer, it is an offence to ask other Officers, and this will likely see your request for a permit denied indefinitely. If you believe you have been assessed unfairly you can contact the Shire's Emergency Management Coordinator or the Chief Bush Fire Control Officer to discuss the matter.

Under the new Australian Fire Danger Rating System, you may not burn if the fire danger rating for the district is "High" or above. Given the current and forecasted weather outlook for March and beyond, it is unlikely there will be many days which are appropriate to burn.


Sandy Cape Caretakers

DRAFT AMENDED LOCAL PLANNING POLICY FOR ADVERTISING DEVICES (SIGNAGE)

This Policy provides a framework for the design, placement and assessment of outdoor advertising signs within the Shire. This Policy intends to ensure that the display of outdoor advertising within the Shire do not adversely impact on the amenity of surrounding land while providing appropriate exposure for businesses, activities or services.

The draft policy proposes the following changes to the policy framework for this form of development:

Revise policy introduction and objectives accordingly.

Provide clear exemptions and interpretations.

Outline signage development application requirements and when a signage strategy will be required.

Outline clear protocols which apply to all signage.

Outline particular areas where signage will not be supported.

Provide specific protocols for common types of signage.


