FIRE BREAKS & FUEL HAZARD REDUCTION NOTICE REQUIREMENTS DUE NOW

Authorised Officers have now commenced property inspections to ensure your property is compliant to the requirements of the Firebreak and Hazard Reduction Notice.

Officers will commence inspections in areas of higher bushfire risk, before undertaking inspections in more built-up or lower risk urban areas throughout the month of November.

Please take the time to review the Notice, if you are still unsure of your properties requirements, you can speak to one of our officers on (08) 9652 0800.

Warning notices for non-compliance are issued in the first instance; infringements and contractor fees will be applied if the landowner fails to rectify the offence by the due dates set.

Harvest & Vehicle Movement Bans

Prohibited Burning Season 1 Nov - 1 Mar

Prohibited burning season has commenced in the Shire of Dandaragan. If you see smoke or fire anywhere in the district between now and the 1st of March you should report it to 000 immediately.



Campfires are now prohibited unless it complies with the Shire's Camping and Cooking Fire Policy.

Total Fire Bans

On a day where a Total Fire Ban has been declared you must not:

- Light any fire
- Use a woodfired bbq, smoker or pizza oven
- Operate any internal combustion powered engine on or near vegetation (certain agricultural activities exempt)
- Conduct hot works such as welding or grinding outdoors
- Use a bee keeping smoker

CERVANTES & JURIEN BAY COASTAL ADAPTATION INVESTIGATION

At the 26 October Council Meeting, Council endorsed the Cervantes and Jurien Bay Coastal Adaptation Investigation which identifies the coastal management options for the central townsite coastal management units in Cervantes and Jurien Bay.

The two primary coastal management actions recommended by the investigation for mitigating coastal erosion hazards in the study areas are:

- Planned / Managed Retreat: Use land-use planning instruments and long-term strategy to systematically move assets with low adaptive capacity out of the hazard zone. This is recommended for all of Jurien Bay central foreshore and the southern end of Cervantes central foreshore. As no built assets are projected to be unacceptably vulnerable until 2070 initial recommendations focus on coastal monitoring and appropriate land-use planning to allow for implementation of voluntary acquisition if required in future decades.
- Protection by Beach Groynes: Undertake the construction of groynes with beach renourishment as necessary to prevent erosion of natural and built assets. This is recommended for the northern end of Cervantes central foreshore



Jurien Bay Central Business District (CBD) Urban Design Plan

Council also endorsed the Jurien Bay CBD Urban Design Plan at 26 October Council Meeting. This plan will be used a reference document to guide the continual redevelopment of the public realm within the Jurien Bay CBD to be a clearly defined area which is connected, vibrant, responsive, and diverse with high levels of utilisation and functionality which attracts private and public investment.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT NEWS

SHIRE OF DANDARAGAN 'ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT GRANT' RECIPIENTS 2023-2024

The Shire's Economic Development Grant, with an annual pool of \$30,000, was offered for the first time this year.

Through this grant program the Shire aims to attract and support activities that align with its key strategic economic development priority areas of:

- · Small Business Development
- Agriculture / Horticulture / Aquaculture (production, value adding production)
- Tourism
- · Renewable Energy

We thank all grant applicants for their interest in the grant program, and congratulate this year's grant recipients, as follows:



Scene Brewing, based on a farm near Dandaragan, was awarded \$7,500 to help build a large cool room for storing Scene Brewing's growing range of preservative free beers. This business enhancement will allow development of the brewery's capacity and capability to increase on-farm production, and supply locally produced value-added products to more outlets within the Shire and across the State.



Dandaragan Heritage and Cultural Centre received \$5,000 to develop architectural and engineering drawings required for the development of a concept plan for the new Dandaragan Heritage and Cultural Centre building. This initiative will support local jobs and contractors, and once built, will attract tourists to the town, which will positively impact retail trade for many local businesses.



Infinity Skate WA, based in Geraldton, will bring the regional Revolve Skate Series to Jurien Bay in 2024 with grant support of \$4,658. Positive economic outcomes from this event include increasing overnight visitors, expenditure at local hospitality venues and on tourism activities, plus more business opportunities being created for local retailers. There will be additional skill development opportunities for local youth created in partnership with the Shire.



Perth Game Fishing Club was awarded a grant of \$5,000 to support the West Australian Open 2024 game fishing competition to be hosted in Jurien Bay. Economic benefits from this event include increased overnight visitors, and increased expenditure at hospitality and tourism providers. From a tourism perspective, state-wide promotion of the competition and visiting competitors will highlight the unique tourist attractions found here and the attractive 'liveability' opportunities available in local communities.



Sports Performance and Management will utilise a grant of \$6,600 to host the 2023 Wildflower Festival of Running Turquoise Coast Run in the Pinnacles and along the Turquoise Way Path. This event continues to support the local hospitality and tourism sectors with visitors staying in local accommodation and increased external spending over several days at local hospitality, tourism, and retail businesses.

We look forward to witnessing the various economic benefits that these projects will deliver across the Shire, which include creating more local jobs, attracting more visitors, building the capacity and capability of local businesses, and attracting investment in the Shire.

Are you our next grant winner? Local businesses with a project that will create economic benefits within the Shire are encouraged to apply for the next round of the Economic Development Grant program. Applications will open in March 2024 and grants will be awarded in July 2024.

SUPPORT FOR BUSINESSES

Travel and Accommodation Subsidies for Apprentices / Trainees / Cadets

WA Agrifood and Beverage Voucher Program

Eligible businesses can apply for up to two vouchers with a combined maximum value of \$20,000 to engage a consultant or technical expert.

Farm Investment Loan

Loans of up to \$2 million are available from the Regional Investment Corporation. The loans can be used to strengthen your farm business, take steps to access markets interstate or outside Australia, and, to prepare for, manage through, or recover from severe business disruptions.

You can use this loan to:

- Fund risk management Prepare for natural disasters, biosecurity risks, market closures or other disruptions such as diversifying markets or farm production.
- Enhance productivity Invest in new infrastructure, machinery, or productivity enhancements to support growth.
- Refinance debt Refinance existing debt at our low interest rate to improve cash flow.

WHEATBELT REGIONAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (RED) GRANT

More grant winners! Congratulations to Brad and Belinda Trist of Jurien Bay Panel and Paint on being awarded a RED grant of \$110,000.

Jurien Panel and Paint will use the grant funds to expand its workshop and to purchase new equipment to meet growing demand.

Once complete, this project is expected to increase regional capacity and job pathways, along with providing an expanded local service to keep more smash repair activity in the local Shire of Dandaragan area.

Jurien Bay Panel and Paint was one of six grant recipients selected from the thirty-three round six grant applicants.

Jurien Panel and Paint joins a growing group of innovative small business owners from the Dandaragan Shire to win RED grants. These include:

- Maincamp at 'Waslee Downs' in Badgingarra, received \$100,000 for their North Deep Water Bore project in Round 3.
- AGRIfresh, citrus producers based near Dandaragan, won \$100,000 for a passionfruit research and production project.
- Barhyd Pty Ltd in Badgingarra won a \$100,000 grant last year to expand their heavy machinery servicing business to provide increased locally based capabilities to the agriculture, mining, renewable energy, and eucalyptus oil distilling industries throughout the Wheatbelt.

The next Wheatbelt RED grant round will open for applications in May 2024. Applications close in June, and winners are usually announced in November. Please contact me for application information edm@dandaragan.wa.gov.au.
