Meadows Road Bushfire

Summer has hit us with a bang, with a massive bushfire threatening the shack communities at Wedge Island, Grey, and the town of Cervantes.

The fire, sparked by a vehicle crash on Monday, November 25, at Meadows Road, escalated rapidly due to shifting winds and was handed over to DFES the same day

Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions (DBCA), Department of Fire and Emergency Services (DFES) and the Shire fought the fire using water bombers, helitankers, and ground crews, while various departments worked to quickly restore essential services afterward.

As well as fighting the fire, there were food, accommodation, evacuations, community communications and media to be managed. This was all done very professionally by the operatives from the three organisations.

The fire was finally contained and brought under control by the Friday afternoon.

The Minister for Emergency Services, Hon. Stephen Dawson MLC, and Commissioner Darren Klemm visited to witness the efforts of volunteers and firefighters in controlling the massive fire.

While there was a huge area of our Shire scarred by the fire, luckily there was minimal damage to infrastructure and the majority of services were restored by the end of the weekend.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the volunteers, career people and the Shire staff for their fantastic work in dealing with this fire which has been one of the biggest we have seen in this area for many years.

I would also like to thank the many residents that put their fire plans into action and all those people that offered assistance during this fire emergency.

Turquoise Coast Festival

After a five-year hiatus, the Indian Ocean Festival now rebranded as the Turquoise Coast Festival was staged at Fauntleroy Park and Dobbyn Park in Jurien Bay.

The festival featured old favourites like the Blessing of the Fleet, the Rope Coiling Competition, market stalls, food vans, and live music by local bands, including Goodstock.

The Festival had many sponsors from state government through Tourism WA. Wheatbelt Development Commission, Shire of Dandaragan, Image Resources sponsored the Kids Zone Marquee, Jurien Bav. Jurien Bay Chamber of Commerce, Jurien Bay Progress Association who also organised the festival, Moora Toyota, Rumbold Ford, Tronox and many small businesses in Jurien Bay that supported the festival with donations of prizes.

The organising committee are very pleased with the way the return of the festival was greeted and look forward to organising the 2025 event.

We are showcasing the four town plans from our recently adopted Council Plan; Jurien Bay is December's feature town.

PLANNING

- Review the Jurien Bay Foreshore Master Plan.
- Complete the Jurien Bay Recreation Precinct Plan.
- Review the Environmental Management Plan for the Jurien Bay Landfill site.
- Prepare a long-term caravan park and camping site strategy, to identify new opportunities and promote sustainable local investment.

DELIVERY

- Commence implementation of the Jurien Bay CBD Masterplan, and construct new public amenities in the CBD area.
- · Begin construction of the east / west runway.
- Develop a cycle and pedestrian pathway between the Coalseam Industrial area and Jurien Bay Heights.
- Implement camp site improvements and environmental rehabilitation projects at Sandy Cape.

ADVOCACY

- Promote the development of key tourist sites including Jurien Bay Marina, former APEX camp, Roberts St.
- Advocate for a resolution to the sea wrack ingress and support the development of the southern commercial precinct of the Jurien Bay Boat Harbour.
- Advocate for continued expansion of health services and the placement of a full-time local community paramedic.

SENIORS WEEK 2024

Seniors Week provided a wonderful opportunity for our seniors to connect with primary-aged students across the Shire. This intergenerational interaction fostered learning, and joy, bridging the gap between generations. It was a meaningful experience that strengthened community bonds and enriched both groups. Badgingarra Primary School had 6 seniors attend, who participated in a tour of the school, led by their buddy, followed by afternoon tea, games, and drawings. Cervantes Primary School had 16 seniors attend, who ran small activities for the children to engage in and learn from. Activities included learning how to recycle, woodworking, playing music, and much more. Jurien Bay District High School had 5 seniors attend, who participated in the students knitting / crocheting project. The ongoing project involves each person knitting or crocheting a square and at the end of the year, combine them all to create a large blanket.

Short-Term Rental Accommodation

(STRA) Register Deadline 31 December 2024

Under the Short-Term Rental Accommodation Act 2024, all providers of STRA within Western Australia, both hosted and un-hosted, will be required to register their property by 1 January 2025. STRA refers to the practice of renting out a property (or part of a property) for a relatively short period of time, usually on a nightly or weekly basis.

Fees apply to registration. From 2 December 2024, registrations will be subject to a \$250 application fee. The fee to renew every 12 months is \$100. Visit the Department of Energy, Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety (DEMIRS) website for information and to register.
