COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Tronox and Shire of Dandaragan Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund

The Tronox and Shire of Dandaragan Community Sporting and Recreation Facilities Fund provides a total of \$30,000 to local clubs and community groups within the Shire for sporting and recreation equipment and small scale infrastructure projects each year.

These grants offer up to half the costs for small equipment to community groups. **The grants are now open and will close on Friday 28 June 2013.** Letters have been sent to community groups and sporting bodies within the Shire with guidelines and application forms. Applications will also be available to download from the Shire's web site at www.dandaragan.wa.gov.au.

Shire of Dandaragan Community Grants

The Shire of Dandaragan offers small grants of up to \$1,500, to Community and Cultural groups within the Shire for events or activities. The purpose of the program is to provide funds for individuals and community based organisations in support of the development of social, economic, recreational, art and cultural benefits. If your group is ineligible for the Tronox / Shire grants, then your group MAY be eligible to apply under the community grants scheme. JURIEN BAY JETTY - PONTOON

In November 2012 a late winter storm caused considerable damage to the swimming pontoon located near the Jurien Bay Jetty. The Shire has recently received confirmation from the company providing insurance coverage to the pontoon, that the cost to fix all damages will be covered. Repairs to the pontoon are now being scheduled. The pontoon will remain out of the water for the winter period and is to be put back out in November 2013, for the start of the summer period.

WHAT DO THE NEW CAT LAWS MEAN FOR YOU AND YOUR FELINE FRIEND?

Important information for all domestic cat owners about the new *Cat At 2011* and the steps they need to take to meet the new cat law requirements, coming in 1 November 2013.

From 1 November 2013, all domestic cats, over 6 months of age, will need to be sterilized, microchipped and registered with your local government. You can microchip your cat at the vet now and help identify your pet if it ever gets lost or injured. Sterilisation now will prevent unwanted kittens, reduce cat numbers in shelters and save wildlife by reducing the number of feral cats in our native bushland.

Local governments will be responsible for administering and enforcing the legislation.

To help identify owned cats, they will need to wear a collar and registration tag.

Cat breeders will need approval from their local government to keep unsterilised cats.
