Strategic Insights

Strategic Insights

The Shire of Dandaragan's overall performance is on par with other councils, based on the views of 267 residents.

- As a place to live, the performance index score is 77 out of 100, on par with the MARKYT® Industry Standard.
- As a governing organisation, the performance index score is 57; 1 index point above the MARKYT® Industry Standard.

Relative to other councils, the Shire is performing **on par or above average in 9 out of 32 measures**. The highest performing areas are waste collection services, library and information services, and playgrounds, parks and reserves.

It is recommended that the Shire creates and promotes a **clear, shared and inspiring vision** for the future. The Shire is 9% points behind the industry average. Moving forward, the community would like the Shire to focus on the following priorities:

- 1. **Economic and tourism development** including attracting new industries and businesses, developing the area for tourism, and boosting job opportunities with a particular focus on improving youth education and employment.
- 2. Local roads and streetscapes including building a bypass to reduce traffic in the Jurien Bay town centre, ensuring road works deliver lasting results, managing speeds along Indian Ocean Drive at turn off points to the Shire, and improving streetscapes.
- 3. How the coastal area is being planned, developed and managed. Residents would like improved coastal protection and conservation while at the same time to see development along the foreshore to activate the area for locals and tourists.
- **4. Sport and recreation** including an improved youth centre, leisure centre with pool, and more festivals and events.
- **5. Playgrounds, parks and reserves**. While this area is a higher performing area, families place great value on these facilities and would to see expansion, improvement and better maintenance.



It is recommended that the Shire focuses on better understanding and meeting the needs of people with a **disability** and **youth**.



- Regional Councils






How to read the MARKYT Benchmark Matrix TM




MARKYT Community Priorities Window TM

Stronger performing areas include library and information services, waste collection services and playgrounds, parks and reserves.


Moving forward, the community would like Council to prioritise economic development, local roads, coastal management, youth services and facilities and tourism promotion (windows F + G).

Secondary priorities include streetscapes, sport and recreation facilities and traffic management.

The Study

The Study

In October, the Shire of Dandaragan administered a MARKYT® Community Scorecard to evaluate community priorities and measure Council's performance against key indicators in the Strategic Community Plan.


Scorecard invitations were mailed by the Shire to all households and emailed to all contacts in the Shire's community databases. The survey was also supported with promotions through the Shire's communication channels, including the website, newsletters and social media.

In total, **267 residents** submitted a response reducing the sampling error to ±5.7% at the 95% confidence interval.

The final dataset was weighted by age and gender to match the ABS Census population profile.

Data has been analysed using SPSS. Where sub-totals add to ±1% of the parts, this is due to rounding errors to zero decimal places.







Challenges | identified by the community

- · Limited business and economic growth.
- · Lack of employment opportunities.
- Not enough permanent residents.
- People and families leaving the area.
- Limited shopping and retail options.
- A priority for 31% of the community.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Develop new industries and attract new businesses to create jobs.
- 2. Better support for existing small business.
- 3. Develop and promote the area for tourism.
- 4. Attract more residents and visitors.

Community Voices

"Driving industry development to increase employment opportunities."

"Providing jobs for the locals. Providing training opportunities for the locals."

"Attracting new business to town, to increase employment opportunities. Fast track a new hotel on the foreshore."

"I would like to see the Shire focus on improving job opportunities and bringing the four towns together more, either through events or other opportunities."

"Supporting new business (primarily smaller businesses) growth in order to facilitate a greater diversity of employment opportunities to retain young people in town."

"Attracting larger scale business to town to create long term employment opportunities for a wider range of people."

"Encourage growth, business, development and infrastructure. Welcome and assist new business. Work with existing businesses and their needs. Focus and welcome tourism to a whole new level - it is now what we survive on."

"You need to attract more people to live in the town. To do that you need to improve the number of businesses. To do that you need to develop strategies to improve the facilities in town for residents and tourists (not caravan owners!) so that the businesses have customers. A bit of a vicious circle but it can be done."

"Population and employment growth through development of industry."

"Would like to see some sort of supermarket i.e. Coles/Woolworths in town. It would be good to have more competition for IGA."

"Shopping mall and variety of groceries. Regular food markets (weekends). Music festival. Beach cleaning. More job opportunities."



Building and maintaining local roads

Challenges | identified by the community

- Too much traffic going through the centre of Jurien Bay townsite.
- Recent road works carried out to a poor standard with damage reappearing.
- Lack of maintenance of rural roads.
- A priority for 24% of respondents.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Lobby for development of the Jurien Bay town centre bypass.
- 2. Ensure lasting road improvements and hold contractors accountable for poor quality work.
- 3. Improve rural road maintenance including regular grading.

Community Voices

"Bypass road urgently needed. Holiday traffic is terrible and dangerous."

"I would like to see the Indian Ocean Drive bypass the town. If a service station and parking for long vehicles was set up on the South end of the bypass, the flow of traffic would be divided so those who just want a break from their driving would bypass the town. The other traffic could be exposed to bill boards, etc. promoting the town."

"An Indian Ocean Drive by-pass for the townsite rather than through traffic."

"Lobby Government to put in bypass road i.e. too busy on main through road - school crossing etc."

"Bypass Rd, we are absolutely disgusted at the roadwoks completed in recent months at the intersection of Jurien East Rd and Indian Ocean Drive. We were inconvenienced for a long time and improvements are worse than before. Road has major bumps and lines are confusing. The job should never have been signed off and paid for until it was improved to a suitable standard."

"Contract work on road maintenance of a poor standard with Jurien Bay townsite (lastest work near airstrip to Jurien East Rd)."

"Holes are appearing in the newest section of Turquoise Way (town area) after a few short months. Contracts need to be written carefully and monitored and inspected regularly."

"Would like to Shire to acknowledge that Dandaragan and Badgingarra are also major parts of the shire, our rural roads are shocking and we rarely see a grader."

"Rural road maintenance must be regular, properly completed & regular road users' concerns addressed."



How the coastal area is being planned, developed and managed

Challenges | identified by the community

- Divergent opinions regarding the Jurien Bay foreshore area.
- Coastal erosion.
- Concerns regarding overdevelopment.
- Bad odours caused by clogged seaweed at the marina.
- Lack of activation of the foreshore.
- A priority for 19% of respondents.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Protect and maintain beaches and dunes.
- 2. Improve ranger presence during busy periods to deter damage to coastal areas.
- Remove and prevent trapped seaweed at the marina to eliminate rotting odours.
- 4. Consider development of the foreshore as a tourist hub to bring more people to the area.

Community Voices

"Keeping beaches clean, rangers acting on reports from locals promptly."

"The destruction and removal of sand dunes in the town should NEVER have happened and would never happen anywhere else. The lack of coastal conservation is a joke.. just look at Sandy Cape sand dune destruction."

"Protection of natural and historical assets, including natural foredune retention. Increased Ranger presence during school holidays and summer periods will contribute to this protection."

"I am REALLY concerned about the plan/proposal for a "high rise" development near the beach...I truly believe that if a 'High Rise" complex is built it will seriously detract from the attraction of Jurien/Jurien Bay."

"Fixing the marina to get rid of the smell so the nice little secluded beach can be used all year."

"Marina tourism development including a pool within the marina, planned & executed in a professional manner (don't let dept Transport design & build it!). Fix the marina breakwater to stop seaweed clogging the marina."

"Development and growth on the foreshore to create a tourist hub."

"More activities for locals and tourists on the foreshore."

"Infrastructure to bring more facilities and job opportunities into town so as to encourage more people to want to live in the area i.e. develop the marina area in Jurien Bay with boardwalks and shops and eateries and bars."

"Please encourage a restaurant/eatery/tavern to develop a site with ocean views. The ocean is our main draw card, and we have very little to showcase that, in terms of dining."



Developing and promoting the area as a tourism destination

Challenges | identified by the community

- Not enough promotion of the area to tourists.
- Lack of signage and streetscaping to welcome tourists and encourage them to stop in the Shire.
- Limited tourist business support.
- A priority for 15% of respondents.

Actions | suggested by the community

- Develop strategies to promote the area to tourists.
- 2. Beautify streetscapes including improving signage and lighting.
- 3. Improve support for tourist-based business.
- 4. Activate the Jurien Bay and Cervantes foreshores for tourism.

Community Voices

"Getting tourists to stay in and around town longer."

"We also believe that tourism or visitor servicing is the future for the whole shire. Adoption of Local Planning Laws that impose restrictions on private enterprise growing and developing this market appear short sighted."

"Encourage small businesses and community groups towards tourism with grants etc."

"Make the town welcoming!! E.g put "Welcome to Jurien Bay" on the entry statements and add "Thanks for visiting and See you again soon" on the back of the entry statements. When reading tourist publications, Jurien Bay doesn't get the equivalent mileage as other towns on this coastal strip."

"Planning to bring in tourists and more residents. Clear way to advertise and promote area! Lighting to Cervantes entrance, you wouldn't know there was a town at the end of it. Also to tourist information areas. Don't concentrate everything on Jurien Bay!!

Use coastline to promote area. Diving, fishing in a sustainable way."

"More signage promoting what is available in Cervantes. Until you get into town you don't appreciate what we have, so at the moment people drive past because they don't know what is available other than the Lobster Shack that promotes itself."

"Lobbying Government in growth of Shire and attracting investors and business e.g. Growth of marina facilities. Growth of airport facilities as a business. Growth of tourism."

"Increasing the appearance of the areas in order to attract more visitors.

More visitors, more money in town, more shops to open or survive."

"You need to make the seafront between the jetty and the Marina more of a place for tourists to have a good time. There is nothing there of any attraction."



Services and facilities for youth

Challenges | identified by the community

- Limited options and activities for youth.
- Not enough education and employment opportunities.
- Families leaving when children are high school aged.
- A priority for 15% of respondents.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Improve spaces, clubs and facilities for youth.
- 2. Bring more events and festivals to the area.
- 3. Advocate to improve education facilities to keep families in the Shire.
- 4. Economic development to increase youth employment opportunities.

Community Voices

"A multi-use youth space. The kids need somewhere they can go to hang out with their friends, but also have a variety of things they can do there - not just a skate park."

"More focus on youth. Shire spend too much on tourists...People leaving town in droves as nothing for youth to do. Our youth group is being held in asbestos old building while empty rooms at the big shiny new shire building. Foreshore should be a focus for locals not just tourists. Youth building on beachfront could be used for lifesaving club etc."

"Target the 10-16yr age groups. Sporting facilities. Youth group. Surf lifesaving club etc. Something to retain the younger generation in town, without them it will continue to be a retirement village."

"Youth activities and educational opportunities. As a mother of 2 I feel this town is only attractive for men (boating, fishing, golf club, bowls club, footy, a pub), singles (if you have a decent job or trade) and retirees. As a young family now it is a great place to have the small town environment but if you want any opportunities for your kids you're better off leaving before high school. Job opportunities won't arise as the small businesses can only survive in peak times."

"Something to keep our youth off the streets, and off drugs. And maybe a couple more festivals for the town, bring some shows to the country people, we see them advertised on TV, but a select few come to Jurien Bay."

"Festivals, events, arts and cultural activities to suit all age groups. To educate and broaden the life experience of our youth, to attract more visitors for economics and town growth, and to create a vibrant happening community in which to live."

"Education for years 7 to 12 and maybe beyond."

"Job creation & facilities/services for kids & teens."



Streetscapes

Challenges | identified by the community

- Litter along streets and verges.
- Weeds spreading due to verge slashing.
- Unappealing streetscapes leading into towns.
- A priority for 12% of respondents.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Remove litter and promote better rubbish disposal practices in the community.
- 2. Increase weed removal.
- Avoid slashing and chemical sprays.
- 4. Mow verges.
- 5. Protect and plant more native flora.
- 6. Beautify streetscapes across the Shire.

Community Voices

"Great push for keeping road verges and beaches litter free."

"I would like the Shire of Dandaragan to improve:...The Ranger services they provide, there is a lot of rubbish laying/blowing around. I understand this is most likely from tourists or people who can not be bothered finding a bin, but rangers who patrol through the town and surrounding areas should be collecting this rubbish to make the town look neat, tidy and inviting."

"Encourage townspeople to take a little more pride in the cleanliness of our town and Shire make sure home owners keep their properties tidy and clear of rubbish. We will never achieve a tidy town award it's a disgrace."

"Better weed control i.e. when slashing road reserves or grassed areas (maintained by Shire) burr weed, turnip, verbesnia etc. are being spread throughout the town of Jurien Bay i.e. Jurien Heights and Shearwater Drive off Lesueur Drive. Do not use any chemicals on property so handpicking is essential to remove these types of weeds amongst all grasses bought in by vacant unmaintained blocks in the area."

"I would also like to see our shire stop destroying our precious roadside verge flora that gives those of us who live here a sense of place and belonging as well as huge tourist potential."

"Beautify main road in between Dryandra & Leusuer Dr."

"Improving the streetscape into town."

"Stronger support for the community in its efforts to improve the aesthetics of the town."

"Plant native trees for areas around town and foreshore."

"...streetscaping for all the main streets instead of just the Jurien main street?

Just a couple of things that I think would assist in helping the smaller towns and attract tourists to all towns too."



Sport and recreation facilities

Challenges | identified by the community

- Not enough recreation facilities for all ages.
- Limited sporting opportunities and activities for children and youth.
- A priority for 11% of respondents.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Develop gym / leisure centre facilities.
- Build a public swimming pool along foreshore.
- 3. Encourage, support and promote local sporting activities for all ages.
- 4. Improve existing sporting facilities and ovals.
- 5. Expand skate park.

Community Voices

"A leisure centre with a pool, gym, crèche, fitness classes, indoor playground etc... Shade in our parks with seating for parents...Better use of the foreshore with an outdoor water playground, beach volleyball, pop up bars etc."

"Improving sport and recreation such as a public swimming pool or ocean bath. Improve facilities at the oval such as oval lighting to attract more sports to town."

"Better facilities for children and retirees e.g. a leisure centre which has a heated spa pool and a swimming pool for Jurien and the surrounding towns. The ocean is not always suitable for swimming and children should be encouraged to swim in a safe area."

"Jurien is in need of another caravan park and a public swimming pool with access for disabled persons."

"Activities for school kids. Need a swimming pool. Only minimal chances for swimming lessons. Kids need activities after school. Develop the area opposite Dobben park."

"Improving and contributing to sporting activities in town."

"Promote local activities e.g. tennis, squash, badminton in Craytales with people to contact. Promote with flyers during holidays."

"Lack of kids sport for girls under 12."

"A decent skate park/activity centre suitable for all ages to use."

"Bigger skate park for the kids. Thank you."



Traffic management and control

Challenges | identified by the community

- · Traffic congestion through Jurien Bay.
- Vehicles travelling too quickly along Bashford Street making it dangerous for pedestrians.
- Accessing townsites off Indian Ocean Drive considered dangerous due to high speeds and no safe slip lanes.
- A priority for 11% of respondents.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Lobby for the development of the Jurien Bay town centre bypass.
- Build traffic calming devices along Bashford Street including roundabouts and zebra crossings.
- 3. Reduce speed limits or improve slip lanes at intersecting roads along Indian Ocean Drive.

Community Voices

"Traffic control going through centre of town."

"De-congesting town centre traffic. Roundabout at corner Bashford St and Roberts St. Right turning lane south into Dryandra Blvd. Parking bay south of Jurien to prevent caravans stopping and trying to do u-turns when they realise there are no more fuel stations after they have left Jurien."

"A bypass for Bashford Street. There is too much through traffic on days when the Indian Ocean Drive is busy. This is a safety issue."

"Roundabouts on Bashford St to slow down traffic to enable cars from side streets access."

"Suggest entrance from White Street as previously planned and exit onto Heaton Street giving the opportunity to turn either right into Roberts Street or continue on to a new round-a-bout at the corner of Heaton and Doust Street directing tourists to Bashford Street. The new round-a-bout would also stop the "hoons" speeding along Heaton Street in front of Seafront Estate where there are often children crossing to go to the playground and park across the road."

"More zebra crossings and school signage especially outside the Shire building."

"Slow to 85kph approaching turnoff to Cervantes North and South on Indian Ocean Drive

– before a death occurs there please. Too many close calls occur there."

"Two entry points into Beachridge off main highway are unsafe. One entry in a 90km zone and one 70km. Both have no points for traffic to go around safely and no proper pull off sections for cars to turn in Beachridge area."



Playgrounds, parks and reserves

Challenges | identified by the community

- Play equipment perceived as old and deteriorating.
- Not enough shade at local parks.
- Limited park maintenance.
- A priority for 10% of respondents.

Actions | suggested by the community

- 1. Upgrade equipment in playgrounds.
- 2. Develop park/play facilities along the foreshore.
- 3. Provide more shade in all parks and over playgrounds.
- 4. Ensure all parks have access to toilets, bins and drink fountains.
- 5. Improve park, reserve and garden maintenance including regular mowing.
- 6. Plant more native trees.

Community Voices

"Play equipment in parks for children. A theme per park."

"Put children play areas along foreshore i.e. Similar to Geraldton townsite."

"A new nature/natural (wood, rope, rocks etc.) playground to replace the existing plastic disintegrated one on the foreshore by the jetty. Splash pad for kids to play in summer and even winter months, especially as they are safer for the younger kids and still fun for the older kids."

"The jetty and the Marina...Build a great promenade between the 2 spots - lots of toilets and change rooms, things for kids like parks and playgrounds."

"Permanent shade structures at parks and playgrounds around town."

"No shade provided at kids play areas."

"More trees and shelter on Catalonia Park Cervantes."

"A small toilet facility put in at pirate park and drink fountain."

"More trees and natural bushland planted in parks and reserves."

"More gardens and parks upgraded."

"Maybe start to mow the park and do the gardens rather than handing out expensive contracts."





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
